The Story of The Lion The Witch and The Wardrobe

When the story starts there is a war.

To keep them safe the children Peter, Susan, Edmund and Lucy go to the countryside to live with the Professor and his housekeeper Mrs. Macready.

When they are playing hide and seek the children come across a wardrobe that leads them to a magical world called Narnia.

Narnia is ruled by the White Witch who covered the land in snow and ice. Any creature who will not do what the White Witch says is captured and turned to stone.

The only thing that can stop the Witch is if a story from long ago comes true. The Story says "When four human children (two boys and two girls) sit on the thrones at the castle, the Witch's power will end".

With the help of Aslan and his loyal army, the Witches powers are weakened. Spring falls on the Land of Narnia and Aslan's army defeat the Witch and her creatures.

Peter, Susan, Edmund and Lucy are crowned Kings and Queens of Narnia where they rule for many years.

The children go back through the wardrobe to their own world. Even though they were gone for a long time, no time has passed at home.

They have learned many things from their journey.

At the end of the show the actors will come on stage to say thank you and goodbye this is called a curtain call.

People will clap and cheer to let the Actors know they enjoyed the show, and some might boo or hiss at the baddie character.

If you want to join in you can but you don't have to.

When the red curtain comes down at the end, that means the show has finished and it's time to go home.

To help make this show more relaxed the production team have made some changes so the lighting is softer and the sound will be quieter.

There are lots of different Characters in this play.

The actors will get dressed up in costumes and play characters.
Some of the characters they play are naughty and some are nice and kind.
They might be a little scary but the actors are just pretending.

She kind, honest and brave.



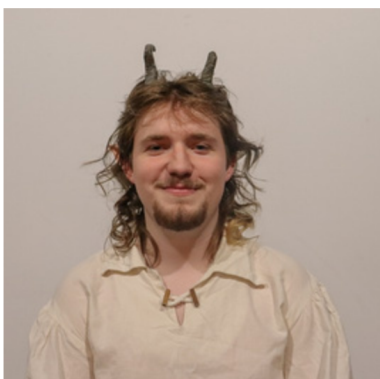
Aslan

What to expect

The Play will last for approximately 2.5hrs

The first half will last about 1 hour-1 hour 10 minutes , then there will be a 20 minute break.

You can buy drinks, snacks and ice cream in the break if you want to.

The second half will last around 45-50 minutes .

Plays are stories on stage, people called Actors pretend to be different characters, Actors are ordinary people who will dress up in different costumes and act out the story on the stage.

The costumes in this play may make the people on stage look like animals and magical creatures.

Before the play starts some of the actors will come on to the stage in their costumes to say hello and to tell you about the play.

So that you know what will be happening before the show starts the Director will come on stage to give you a short outline of the whole story.

Once they have left the stage lights in the theatre will be dimmed. This means the play will be starting very soon.

When the show starts music will come on and the lights will change. People might clap or shout because they are excited that the show is starting. You can clap if you want to, but you don't have to. If it is too loud you can cover your ears or wear your ear defenders .

If you need to take a break while the show is on you can go to the Foyer Coffee Bar or the Circle Coffee Bar.
